Dear Inala residential families and carers,

### **Update from NSW Health issued 29<sup>th</sup> July and 30<sup>th</sup> July 2020**

We hope this finds you well.

Last night and this evening, Inala and all residential and home care service providers received an update from Dr Kerry Chant, Chief Medical Officer NSW Health with advice and guidance for people who reside in **Bankstown, Waverley, Woollahra, Randwick, eastern part of City of Sydney, Parramatta, Fairfield, Liverpool, Campbelltown, Camden, Wingecarribee and Wollondilly Local Government Areas.**

In response to this communication, Inala has implemented further protocols to ensure adherence to recommendations and guidelines from NSW Health:

These include:

#### **Restrictions for families visiting Inala residents**

- If you **live** in the South Western Sydney, Parramatta, Bankstown, Waverley, Woollahra, Randwick or eastern part of City of Sydney local government areas you are **unable to visit Inala** until further notice
- If you have **visited** the South Western Sydney, Parramatta, Bankstown, Waverley, Woollahra, Randwick or eastern part of City of Sydney local government areas in the past two weeks you are **unable to visit Inala** until further notice
- If you **live** in the South Western Sydney, Parramatta, Bankstown, Waverley, Woollahra, Randwick or eastern part of City of Sydney local government areas you will be **unable to take your son/daughter/loved one home**
- Inala residents who live in hotspot LGAs are unable to visit their family at home (This currently applies to residents of Blue Gum which is located in the Parramatta LGA)

#### **New Protocols in place for staff**

- Staff who live or have visited the South Western Sydney, Parramatta, Bankstown, Waverley, Woollahra, Randwick or eastern part of City of Sydney local government areas are provided with and will **wear a surgical mask at work**

- When providing care to clients who live in or who have visited the above local government areas staff are provided with and will **wear a surgical mask at work**
- Staff who have visited any of the locations on the same date as a COVID-19 case will be excluded from work for 14 days since their visit to the listed location (We are sending this list to staff each day when there are updates)

### **Day services and Community activities**

As indicated in our communications, we are monitoring daily developments and have made some changes to strengthen our guidelines, particularly in relation to interaction with and accesses to with wider community, venues and activities.

### **Ongoing protocols**

- As also previously communicated we maintain concerted vigilance with all aspects of enhanced cleaning, hygiene, social distancing, temperature checks and daily symptom monitoring. As outlined above, all staff who reside in or have visited identified LGAs are wearing masks as risk minimisation procedure.
- All staff and clients with a temperature greater than 37.5 degrees Celsius or respiratory systems (including fever, cough, sore/scratchy throat, shortness of breath, loss of taste or smell) will be excluded from work or day programs. They will be advised to isolate at home and seek COVID-19 testing. All staff and clients attending Day services are temperature checked and monitored for any symptoms on arrival and daily.
- Visitors to Inala, across all services, will be asked a series of questions on arrival. Depending on individual responses, you may be asked to defer your visit or wear a mask during your visit. (Please note restrictions to visitors from identified LGA areas detailed above).

### **Attendance at Day services**

We have consulted with NSW Health who have confirmed that our ongoing protocols meet all recommended COVID-19 risk management guidelines and advice. We will communicate with all non-resident families and/or carers for clients who live in the identified Local Government Areas to confirm their own conformity to NSW Health advice.

Wherever appropriate and/or assessed as needed, Individual risk assessments will be conducted and appropriate measures put in place to continue to provide or re-design supports as much as practicable.

### **Please continue to be vigilant**

We encourage you to be vigilant, continue to practice social distancing and good hygiene limit your interactions in these hot spot areas as much as is possible.

If you have been in a 'hotspot' area or venue, please follow Government recommended guidelines in relation to testing and isolating. **A list of venues and areas can be found [here](#)**, this list is being updated regularly as new cases are confirmed.

If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to contact us. We will keep you updated of any further changes or information from NSW Health.
