


### **Message from our CEO**

As the year draws to a close and we prepare for the holiday season, I wanted to reflect on what has been achieved at Inala this year, and what a year it has been! I would like to take this opportunity to thank every single supporter whose generosity has enabled us to achieve so much.

This year we have been able to get back to our usual calendar of fundraising events, which resulted in more than \$300,000 raised. Our Tax Appeal raised \$163,000, and we have received an additional \$127,000 in grants and other donations, bringing the total support we have received from you this year to just over \$600,000!


